Everything Dispensary Owners Need to Know to Stay Compliant and Operational



Legal Overview

- Seed-to-Sale Tracking System: Metrc (Mandatory since August 24, 2022)
- Regulating Authority: Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA)
- · Applies To: All licensed medical marijuana businesses (dispensaries, cultivators, processors)
- Non-Compliance Penalties: Fines (\$500+ per violation), license suspension or revocation

Metrc Onboarding Checklist for Dispensaries

1. Step 1: OMMA License & Metrc Training

- Hold a valid OMMA dispensary license
- Complete Metrc New Business Training (required for login access)

2. Step 2: Activate Your Metrc Account

- Receive login credentials from Metrc after training
- · Log in and complete your business profile setup
- Assign additional users (staff) with proper roles

3. Step 3: Order Tags

- Package Tags (\$0.25 each)
- Plant Tags (\$0.45 each, if applicable)
- Tags are shipped to your licensed location

4. Step 4: Tag Opening Inventory

- Tag and upload all existing cannabis products before making any sales
- Ensure tag IDs match actual inventory

Fee Type Amount

Metrc Access Fee \$40/month per license

Tag Costs \$0.25–\$0.45 each

6. Step 6: POS System Integration

- · Automate sales reporting
- · Reduce manual errors
- Ensure real-time compliance

Understanding Metrc Tags

All cannabis in your store must have active, trackable Metrc tags.

- Plant Tags: Used in cultivation, applied at vegetative stage
- Package Tags: Used for products in inventory and sales

Package Tag Includes

Licenses must be renewed annually. Renewal includes:

- Unique 24-digit ID
- Quantity
- Test results
- Chain of custody
- License ID of origin

Daily Compliance Requirements

1. Record Sales Immediately

- · All product sales must be recorded in Metrc same-day
- Use integrated POS to auto-sync sales
- · Manual entry must be done before closing

2. Receive & Transfer Inventory

- · Verify transfers in Metrc before accepting
- Match tag IDs and product info with manifest
- Initiate all outbound transfers within Metro

3. Confirm Testing Results

- Valid Certificate of Analysis (CoA)
- · Results uploaded into Metrc
- Contact supplier/lab for missing results

4. Audit Inventory Regularly

- · Match physical counts with Metrc data
- · Correct discrepancies immediately using reason codes
- · Keep documentation for all adjustments

5. File Zero Inventory Reports (If Needed)

- · Submit a Zero Inventory Report by the 15th of the next month
- Done via Metrc's "Operational Exception" function

What Happens If You Don't Comply?

✓ Violation Type	Potential Consequences
Untagged Inventory	\$500+ fine per violation
Sales Not Logged in Metrc	License investigation
Selling Untested Products	Product seizure & fines
Repeated Non-Compliance	License suspension/revocation

Metrc + IndicaOnline = Full Compliance Made Simple

- Real-time syncing of sales, inventory, and transfers

Building a Culture of Compliance

- Treat Metrc updates as part of standard closing duties
- Know how to check and confirm tag IDs and lab results
- Understand the importance of traceability and accountability

IndicaOnline POS	Sales, inventory, compliance
CoA Documentation	Verifies lab test status
OMMA Regulations (oklahoma.gov)	State rulebook for cannabis
